CHAUFFEURS IN GREAT RIOT

Several Persons Are Injured in Trouble Resulting From a Big Strike of Taxicab Drivers in Paris.

PARIS, Feb. 1.—Serious rioting in which scores of persons were injured resulted today from the strike of the taxicab drivers.

The trouble started when a body of strikers attacked several strike-breakers, many sympathizers of the chauffeurs joining in the attack. A riot call was turned in and order was restored only after the crowd had been charged by the carabiniers and the police, aided by a company of infantry.

RIFLES READY TO QUELL RIOTS

Textile Mills at Lawrence Reopen

Thousands of Militiamen Stand Guard—10 Per Cent of Force Back.

LAWRENCE, Mass., Feb. 1.—Armed with repeating rifles and plentifully supplied with ammunition, several thousand militiamen stood guard at the textile mills here today when an attempt was made to resume operations. Although most of the mills opened, less than 10 per cent of the regular forces responded to the starting whistle.

Although serious trouble was predicted by the soldiers and mill owners when work was resumed, no disorders had occurred up to noon.
