STAKE CLAIMS ON MAN'S RANCH

SOUTH BEND, Wash., Feb. 3.—Determined to hold possession of mining claims they staked out on the ranch of John Ellsworth, near here, 150 men and women, who are armed, are camping today along the South Fork river despite the efforts of the sheriff to dislodge them.

Early in the week it was learned that a valuable vein of gold bearing quartz had been found on the Ellsworth ranch. There was an immediate rush for the locality from here and other towns. Ellsworth interviewed a lawyer when he found prospectors squatting on his property. The lawyer appealed to the sheriff, who succeeded in dislodging them, but they returned as soon as he left. The colony is being added to by recruits who are arriving from outside points on every train.
