

Reports received from Captain Charles de F. Chandler, in charge of the United States army aviation camp at Augusta, Ga., show the value of the aeroplane for scouting purposes. Observations and maps showing the topography of the country in the neighborhood of Augusta accompany the reports much of the material being obtained with the aid of the camera while in rapid flight above the earth. Several plates made at an altitude of 700 feet gave such good results that Brigadier General James Alien is encouraging the aviators to further experiments at greater aititude.
