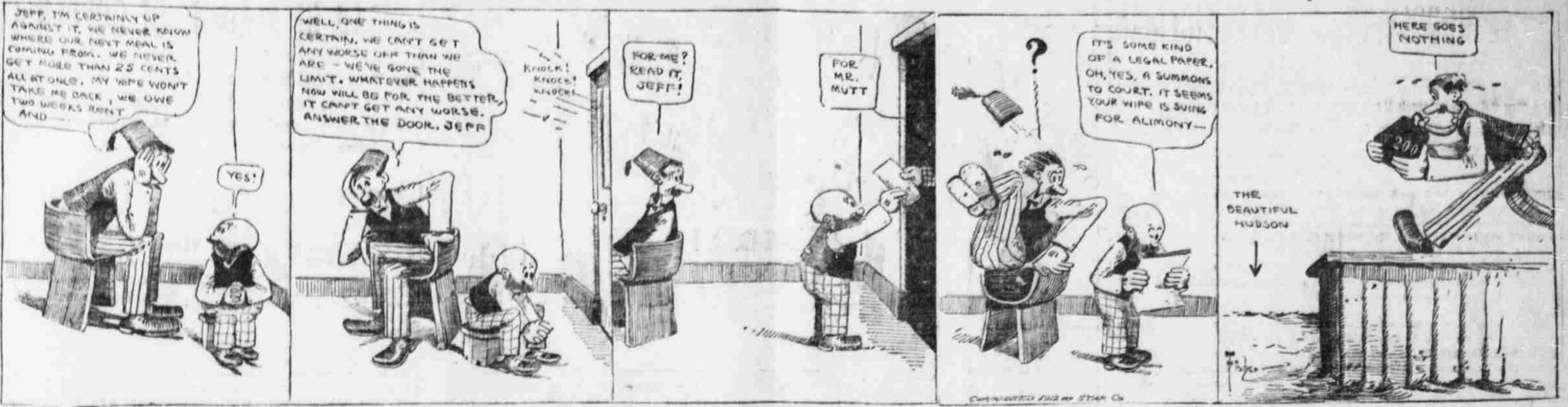


Things Are Never So Bad but They Can Be Worse
