SPOKANE FIRMS SEEK TWO MILLION REFUND

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 22.—Sixty Spokane firms today filed with the interstate commerce commission a demand for a \$2,000,000 refund on freight charges collected by western railroads above what would have been collected if the commerce court had not enjoined the rate decision of the interstate commerce commission on intermountain tariffs. This is one of the largest amounts shippers have ever asked as a refund.

PITTSBURG STEEL KING WANTS TARIFF ON IRON

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 22.—Willis King of Pittsburg, vice president of the Jones and Laughlin Steel company, made a strong appeal before the senate finance committee today in favor of maintaining the duty on steel. He defended the Gary dinners, which, he said, kept "producers from being panic-stricken and from cutting rates to ruinous figures." King argued in favor of protecting steel and iron and said foreigners today have the better of the steel business on the Pacific coast because of the high freight rates from the east.
