

MRS. COLVIG DIES AT FAMILY HOME

Well Beloved Woman Passed Away Early Sunday Morning—Had Been Home From Portland But a Few Hours When the End Came.

In the death of Mrs. W. M. Colvig which occurred at the family home on Laurel street, in Medford at 12:30 Sunday morning, February 25, 1912, Medford loses one of its best loved and most respected citizens.

Mrs. Colvig was quite prominent in social and lodge affairs and a few years ago was grand chief of honor of the Degree of Honor, a woman's auxiliary to the Ancient Order of United Workmen.

Deceased was the mother of seven children, five of whom, together with her husband, survive her. The children now living are Mrs. C. L. Reames, Mrs. R. G. Gale, Mrs. W. J. Warner, Vance and Donald Colvig, all living in Medford.

Funeral services were held at the late residence at 1 o'clock today, Rector Sherrin of St. Mark's Episcopal church officiating; interment in the Jacksonville cemetery.
