CANAL TOLLS FIXED BY BILL

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 29.—The Panama canal bill to be reported to the house by the committee on interstate and foreign commerce, it is learned today, will provide that the president shall have authority to prescribe the canal tolls, but that these tolls shall not be higher than \$1.25 per ton net. It is provided also that the toll for each passenger through the canal shall not exceed \$1.50.

The rate charged American ships passing through the canal shall not be lower than that paid by the vessels of other nations.

Any attempt to obstruct or destroy the canal shall be punishable by a fine of \$10,000 or ten years imprisonment, or both.

HIGH SCHOOLS TO BE UNIVERSITY GUESTS

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Feb. 29.—Great plans are being made to entertain the members of the different high schools of Oregon who will be guests of the University of Oregon during the Interscholastic Track meet which will be held in Eugene May 11th. At a meeting of the Dramatic club last night it was decided to give half the proceeds to insure the success of the meet. The date of the play was set for May 11th and complimentary tickets will be given to all the high school students in Eugene at that time. This means that the meet this year will be better than ever.

EMBEZZLING UNIONIST CAUGHT AT PENDLETON

CHICAGO, Feb. 29.—Chicago police today were notified of the arrest at Freewater, Ore., of A. W. Monoux, who is wanted here on a charge of embezzling \$4100 from the funds of the American Brotherhood of Cement Workers of which he was an officer.

Sheriff Taylor of Pendleton county, Oregon, telegraphed the Chicago authorities that Monoux, fleeing to Pendleton county under the assumed name of W. A. Van Buren, had purchased an apple orchard there and was living on it when arrested. Monoux's arrest followed his communicating with his family in Chicago.

MRS. AHRENS ACCIDENTALLY SHOT; WILL LIKELY RECOVER

Mrs. M. M. Ahrens was seriously injured Thursday morning when a revolver fell from a dressing table and was discharged. The bullet penetrated her left side. She was rushed to the Sacred Heart hospital, and is said to have an excellent chance to recover.

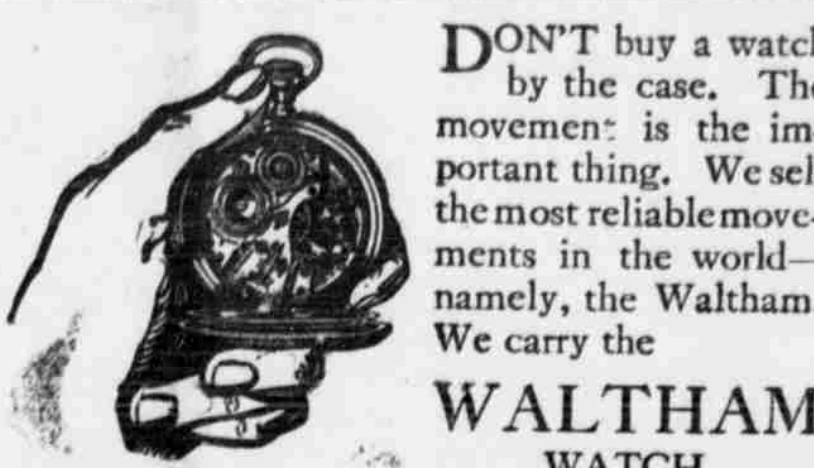
