

EXTERMINATING BLIND PIGS.

S EVERAL years ago Grants Pass voted itself "dry." A large minority, however, wanted it wet and it has been more or less wet since.

First a prohibition mayor was elected. The blind-pigs did a thriving business. It was declared "impossible" to enforce the law.

An "open town" mayor followed, elected to "wink" at the sale of liquor-and he winked. It was again declared impossible to enforce the law.

Robt. G. Smith, an anti-prohibitionist, was elected mayor this winter on a law enforcement program. It had been declared impossible to enforce the prohibition laws, but the new mayor has been showing how easy it is to accomplish the "impossible,"


Then Mayor Smith drafted an original ordinance that is a terror to the illegal dispenser of booze. 
