

BUICK '34' FIRST OVER SISKIYOU

Marvelous Feat Performed by Little Roadster—Carries Four Passengers and 150 Pounds of Baggage.

Automobile records were shattered Friday, March 1, for the Rogue river valley, when a little Buick "34" roadster, 22 1-2 h. p., crossed the Siskiyou mountains carrying four passengers and 150 pounds of baggage. The car left here at 10 a. m. and at 9 p. m. was at Yreka, Cal.

The feat is considered a marvelous one at this season of the year. Never before has a car passed over this range until much later in the season. The car was driven by Mrs. W. L. Noell, who was accompanied by Mr. Noell, a friend and Roy Hodson, a mechanic.

Over the telephone today Hodson told of the difficulties of the trip. The road, at best, a hard one, was a foot deep in slush and snow at the summit. Yet the staid little car bucked into it in a splendid manner.

The trip was arranged by George Kremer, manager of the Bear Creek Motor Car company of this city, which has the agency for the Buicks. The record will probably stand for some time.

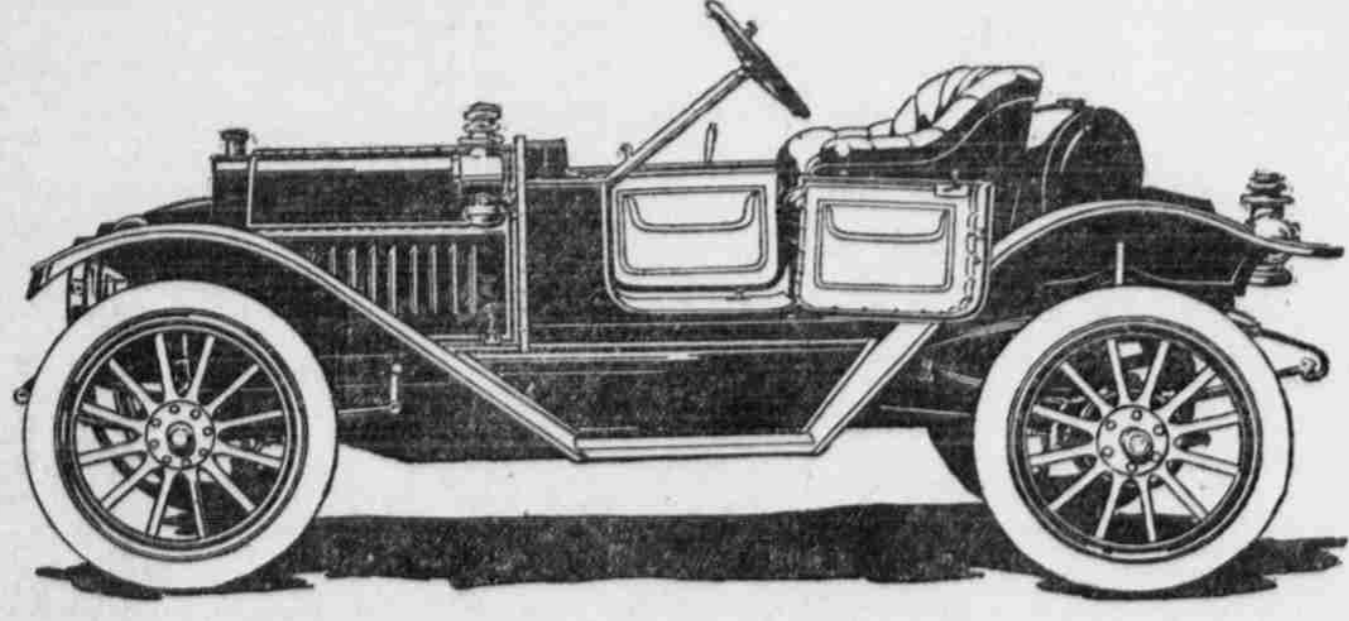
