


If Mutt Hadn't Looked Out of the Window, It Would Have Been All Right

PAID DEPARTMENT IS AUTHORIZED

The city council passed an ordinance Tuesday evening providing for a paid fire department, consisting of six men, a chief, assistant chief, and four firemen. These men are to be paid, chief \$85; assistant chief \$75; and the men \$69 a month. The matter of salaries is said to be not entirely satisfactory to the present firemen. The matter will be discussed at a meeting of the volunteer department at an early date. They favor salaries as follows: Chief \$100; assistant chief \$80 and the men \$70 a month.
