GARDINER HELD FOR ALLEGED CONSPIRACY

NEW YORK, March 8.—Former State Senator Gardiner and George Decker, accused of conspiracy to defraud Wm. Haslett, an aged wealthy realtor, were today held for the action of the grand jury here. It is charged that Gardiner, assisted by Decker, who was employed as a nurse in Haslett's home, induced the realtor to sign over to him the power to act as Haslett's attorney. In this way, it is alleged, Gardiner hoped to secure control of valuable property owned by Haslett.

When the authorities broke into Haslett's home recently they found the realtor sitting on the floor, over which \$20,000 in bills had been littered.
