

BURGLARS MAKE DARING ESCAPE

PENTICION, B. C., March 20.—After holding up a store at Kelowna and a hotel at Okanagan Mission, Walter Bryde, alias W. S. James, a deserter from the United States army was arrested here yesterday in the British Columbia hotel by Provincial Constable Aston. Placed in irons the prisoner with another suspect named Frank Wilson, were being taken up the lake to Vernon last night when the two suddenly attacked Chief of Police Raebie and Aston, while they were in their banks, shot the latter in the head and beat the other man unconscious.

Coolly unloosing their leg and hand irons from keys in the officers' pocket the two men made their way ashore at the first point the vessel touched. Both were armed to the teeth with the police officers' weapons, consisting of two automatic Colts with two hundred cartridges.

Poses were collected from Penticion and early this morning the desperadoes were sighted three miles from Peachland. It is expected that a pitched battle will take place before the men are captured. Constable Aston lies dangerously wounded in the head and at Kelowna hospital.

DON'T WANT TAFT SAYS HIRAM JOHNSON

SACRAMENTO, Cal., March 20.—"The significant thing in the North Dakota primaries," said Governor Johnson today, "is the vote for Taft. The progressive vote in that state, as reported by the sum total vote for La Follette and Roosevelt. The reactionary vote is represented by the total received by Taft.

"The election there demonstrated that the people do not want Taft, and that whenever they have the opportunity of expression they will make this so plain that no one can doubt it. Princess Elizabeth will be 18 years old next November and Manuel will be 23.

Chinese Oil King Blackmailed

SHANGHAI, March 20.—According to the demands of the brigands who several days ago kidnaped his son, Sheng Kung Pao, the oil king of China, today paid over \$100,000 ransom, and the boy was restored to him.

To Increase British Navy

LONDON, March 20.—Declaring that Great Britain must maintain 60 per cent more dreadnaughts than Germany, Winston Churchill, the new first lord of the admiralty, today proposed that the government build twenty-one dreadnaughts during the six years. The proposition was offered by Churchill in the house of commons while introducing his naval estimates.

Convicts Governor's Guests

PHOENIX, Ariz., March 20.—Nine convicts at the state penitentiary at Florence returned to their labor today, following a dinner as guests of Governor George W. P. Hunt. The men are members of the prison baseball team, organized at the governor's suggestion. The team probably will play at Phoenix next Sunday, before the members of the first state legislature.

Big Hay Pile at Wapato.

WAPATO, Wb., March 20.—After twenty-five days, the owner of the Wapato ranch today claims to have piled up the biggest load of baled hay in the northwest. The pile contains 20,937 bales and weighs 1,523 tons.

BREMERTON, Wash., March 20.—Ending a long and distinguished career, Rear Admiral Chauncey Thomas, U. S. N., hoisted down his flag on the cruiser West Virginia and left today for San Francisco, where he will meet Mrs. Thomas. The admiral retires from the service for age next month. He and Mrs. Thomas leave San Francisco March 25 for Panama.

Wilson Club is O. K.

SACRAMENTO, Cal., March 20.—Woodrow Wilson notified Secretary of State Jordan by telegraph today that he had sanctioned the organization now using his name in the presidential primary campaign in California. Wilson is the first presidential aspirant formally to endorse the list of delegates named in his behalf.

De La Luz Solo Influenced

CHIHUAHUA, March 20.—General De La Luz Solo, commanding 500 rurales garrisoning the city of Parral, telegraphed to General Orozco today he and his men would join the revolution. The decision came quickly after Orozco had hinted at attacking him.

CHINESE FINANCES CAUSE UNEASINESS

SHANGHAI, March 20.—Grave uneasiness is felt here among Chinese financiers who are interested in the maintenance of the present government at the growing disinclination on the public's part to accept the paper money of the republic.

Just how much of this money has been issued even the men who issued it do not know. The Sun Yat Sen government at Nanking, was pressed for funds, had no means of getting gold or silver, and as a result set up a printing press and ran off paper currency as it was needed. No one kept track of the amount, but as the paper was used to pay the troops and other government workers, the total undoubtedly runs high into the millions. To make the situation worse, the plates used by the republicans were crude, and their notes have been extensively counterfeited.

CIGAR STORE CLERK IS BOUND, GAGGED, ROBBED

SEATTLE, Wash., March 20.—C. R. Christie, night clerk for one of Gunst's cigar stores here, is in bed today as a result of being gagged and tied to a chair all night by two robbers who entered the store just before closing time. After taking Christie's watch and \$50 from his pockets they tried to make him open the safe, which contained \$100. He refused, and after he had been bound and the thieves had selected their supply of choice brands of cigars they left.

ROGERS TO HANG FOR MURDER OF JEWELER

SAN FRANCISCO, March 20.—John S. Rogers, sentenced to hang on May 24, for the murder of Benjamin Goodman, was taken to San Quentin prison today in charge of Deputy Sheriffs Woodhall and Kelly. Since the failure of his attempt to break jail last Wednesday night Rogers has been extremely docile, but the officers deemed it wise to send him across the bay under double guard to insure his safe delivery to the penitentiary.

Hold Up Mississippi Train

CORINTH, Miss., March 20.—Mobile & Ohio passenger train No. 4, northbound, was held up and the express safe blown open and robbed seven miles south of Corinth tonight by four men heavily armed and masked. Bloodhounds have been telegraphed for and a posse has been organized to take up the pursuit. It is reported the safe contained \$60,000.
