The contract for the laying of a six-inch lateral sewer on Laurel street from Eleventh street to Thirteenth was awarded to Chilgren Bros.

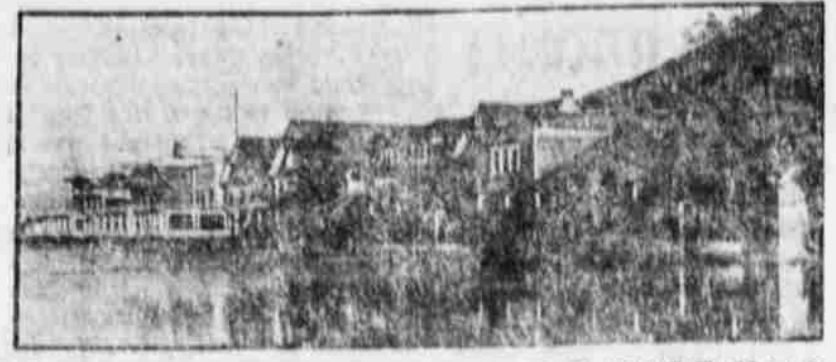
DRAW JURY TO TRY TACOMA CENSUS TAKERS
