DISCUSS PLANS FOR APPLE SHOW

SPOKANE, Wn., March 23.—Representatives of the commercial apple districts of the northwest will meet in Spokane, April 2, to decide the future of the National Apple show. All phases of the apple industry, including the establishment and practical operation of a central selling exchange and the matter of brand an trade mark also will be discussed by growers. E. P. Cartier Van Dissel, chairman of the board of directors of the National Apple Show, Inc., said today that many orchardists in Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana and British Columbia, who exhibited at the four last shows, favor the plan of holding the 1912 competitive exhibition in Spokane.

"Two plans have been advanced so far," Mr. Van Dissel added. "One is to make a bigger and better show in Spokane and the other is to send a large train exhibit, representative of all districts in the northwest, on an extended tour of the central and eastern states. There also are some growers who favor both plans."
