BEGIN LEGAL ACTION TO BETTER SEATTLE HARBOR

SEATTLE, Wash., March 28.—The first definite step in the harbor development of Seattle of \$5,000,000 which has been voted for by the people during the last two years will be taken in the condemnation proceedings to be ordered by the county commissioners today on the Duwamish waterway, immediately upon the receipt of an opinion as to the legality of the proceedings by Prosecuting Attorney Murphy. Bonds for \$600,000 will be issued for this purpose.

OFFICER OF NAVY IS CONFIDENT OF ACQUITTAL

BREMERTON, Wash., March 28.—Lieutenant C. K. Jones, on court martial here, charged with scandalous conduct, resulting in the breaking up of the home of a brother officer, feels confident today of exoneration. Lieutenant C. S. McReynolds, on cross examination yesterday admitted that Lieutenant Jones was in no way responsible for the court's decree of divorce obtained by him from his wife and that they agreed to a separation before Jones began to consort with her.

To Discuss Educational Problems

WATERLOO, Iowa, March 28.—More than a thousand teachers from the northeastern part of this state are in attendance at the eighteenth annual meeting of the Northeastern Iowa Teachers' association, which opened here today for a three days' session. Many important educational problems will be discussed at the general meetings and sectional conferences and the list of speakers includes many distinguished educators, among them Superintendent Carroll G. Pearce of Milwaukee, president of the National Teachers' association, Hon. Henry G. Pattengil, former state superintendent of schools of Michigan; President F. A. Cotton of the Wisconsin state normal, and others.

Cousin of Poet Dies

PASADENA, Cal., March 28.—Hubert Longfellow, a cousin of the famous American poet, Henry Wadsworth Longfellow, dropped dead this morning in the garden of his home at 1515 San Pasqual street. Mr. Longfellow has not been in good health for several months but his condition was not regarded as serious. He was 88 years of age. The cause of his death was heart failure.

Missouri Selects Site

SAN FRANCISCO, March 28.—Pending the arrival of his colleagues, Commissioner Frank L. McDavid, Commissioner Jose Black of Missouri has selected today a tentative site for his state's building at the Panama Pacific 1915 exposition here. McDavid will arrive April 4, when the site will be definitely decided upon and the deed to the land turned over.

Twenty-eight republicans and twelve democrats held Stephenson's election valid. Eighteen democrats and sixteen republicans voted to declare it corruptly obtained.
