

### SECOND TRAGEDY NEBRASKA PRISON

LINCOLN, Neb., March 29.—Another tragedy occurred in the Nebraska state penitentiary this morning when Charles Davis, a half breed Indian, stabbed John Strong, a negro murderer, to death in the dining hall. Only recently three of the prison officials were killed by three convicts who escaped in an outbreak, two of the convicts later meeting death in a pitched battle with a sheriff's posse.

Davis attacked Strong while the convicts were at breakfast. Drawing a dagger, he slashed Strong's jugular vein before the guards could interfere. The Indian was overpowered but refused to give any explanation for his deed.

### MAN CHARGED WITH FRAUD BROUGHT BACK

Sheriff Jones returned late Thursday night from Woodburn, Ore., having in custody A. E. Austin, who is charged with defrauding O. M. Selaby of this city out of \$500 by selling him the state rights to a patent.

Austin's preliminary hearing has not as yet been set in the justice's court.

#### To Discuss Live Topics

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., March 29.—The first session of the sixteenth annual meeting of the American Academy of Political and Social Science began here today. This year's meeting is devoted to the discussion of the initiative and referendum and other topics of live importance, and more than the usual number of distinguished Americans will make addresses at the several sessions.

#### Fear Germans Will Lose

BERLIN, March 29.—Speaking in the reichstag, Count Kanitz, conservative declares that warnings should be issued to Germans against investments in foreign countries without careful investigation. He stated that \$112,000,000 of German capital is invested in foreign countries, which could be used to better advantage and profit at home.

#### Family Burned in Home

WILKESBARRE, Pa., March 29.—Burned to death in their home in Hanover, a suburb of this city, the bodies of Charles Melick, his wife and three children, were found there today. The wife was discovered lying in bed, with her baby under her arm. The daughter, aged 8, was found with her legs protruding from under the bed, where she had evidently crawled. The father's body was in the cellar.

#### Gretna Green Records at Auction

LONDON, March 29.—Many celebrated romances that occurred during the reigns of the three Georges and William IV, and in the early Victorian era, were recalled by the sale at Sotheby's today of the original certificates of marriages at Gretna Green. The lot embraced more than one thousand runaway match certificates, upon some of which appeared the names of men and women of wide celebrity.

### GAFFNEY WHIPS BATTLING DANE

Tommy Gaffney, the lightweight pugilist leaped into fame at Salt Lake City last week by winning a decision in a ten-round bout over Battling Nelson, the ex-champion, who put Tommy to sleep in three rounds in this city a few months ago. Gaffney not only out-pointed the Dane, as might be expected, but also out-fought him, according to the account of the battle in one of the Salt Lake newspapers.

He sent the Dane to his knees in the fourth round and after that Gaffney had things all his own way. In the last half of the tenth round, Nelson, who was all but out, deliberately fouled his antagonist and the referee immediately stopped the bout and declared Gaffney the winner. Enraged, Nelson rushed at the referee, but was held back by the fans who swarmed into the ring and carried Tommy to the dressing room on their shoulders. Gaffney's share of the purse was \$800, which now entitles him to be considered above the ham and beans class in the pugilistic world.

### DESERT ROBBERS SLAY VICTIMS

SAN BERNARDINO, Cal., March 29.—Attacked by robbers in the Mojave desert, Lee Smith is dead and Claude Anderson is on the verge of mental collapse today, according to the statement of hospital attendants to whom Anderson told a terrible story of a desert battle and his subsequent suffering upon his arrival here.

Both men are said to live at Fort Gibson, Oklahoma. They left San Bernardino three months ago on a prospecting tour. According to Anderson, desert bandits killed Smith and buried his body in the sand. They left Anderson for dead.

BANDON, Ore., March 29.—Following a quarrel with her, Bert McDuffy today shot and seriously wounded his wife and then turned the revolver on himself and took his own life. Mrs. McDuffy was shot through the side and may die. McDuffy was 40 years of age and an old resident of Bandon. The couple had three children.

### HUMAN CARRIER TYPHOID GERMS

SAN FRANCISCO, March 29.—In Henry Olsen, a brawny good natured sailor, 28 years of age, now confined in the marine hospital at the Presidio here, with his own consent physicians today declare they have discovered the most deadly human carrier of typhoid germs ever brought to their attention. It is claimed that Olsen, who is himself perfectly healthy, has caused no less than four deaths and has infected 28 persons.

Olsen was stricken with typhoid in November, 1907, and discharged as cured three months later. After joining the crews of several steamers among all of which cases of typhoid immediately developed, Olsen is alleged to have spread several epidemics in San Francisco, Oakland and Los Angeles during the past three years.

OLYMPIA, Wn., March 29.—Governor M. E. Hay today offered a reward of \$1,000 for the capture of John Turnow, the Chehalis county outlaw who is alleged to have murdered his twin nephews and Deputy

Sheriffa Colla McKeate and A. V. Elmer.
