

MADE WOLGAST STEP SOME

Tommy McFarland, the Fond du Lac, Wis., lightweight who is to meet Bobbie Evans in a ten round contest here next Wednesday night is expected to arrive from San Francisco tomorrow and will complete the rest of his training at the Medford Athletic club.

A remarkable thing about McFarland is that he holds the record for being the shortest lightweight in the business but judging the class of boxers he has met and defeated he evidently is not hampered much by his shortness for he seems able to get there just the same.

McFarland began to gain prominence a little more than a year ago when at his home town Fond du Lac, Wis., he was matched to box the light weight champion of the world Ad Wolgast ten rounds. Prior to this match McFarland had been coming along steadily beating all comers in and around his home town, so his many admirers decided that it was time for Tommy to meet a real champ and a match with Wolgast was secured. Ad thought he had picked an easy one in the Fond du Lac lad, but he was given the surprise of his life as Mr. Wolgast had all he could do to secure a draw decision from the chunky lad whom he termed "easy pickings."

Since then McFarland has been roaming around the west meeting all comers. Tommy Gary, Jack White, Frankie Conley and Willie Ritchie a few of the boys McFarland has fought lately.

His coming opponent, Bobbie Evans, is well known locally having fought two recent bouts with Young Dixon.

In meeting McFarland, Evans is called upon to box the best boy he has as yet met, but Bobbie is full of confidence and says he is just beginning to feel like himself once more and that he will give a good account of himself when he hooks up with McFarland.
