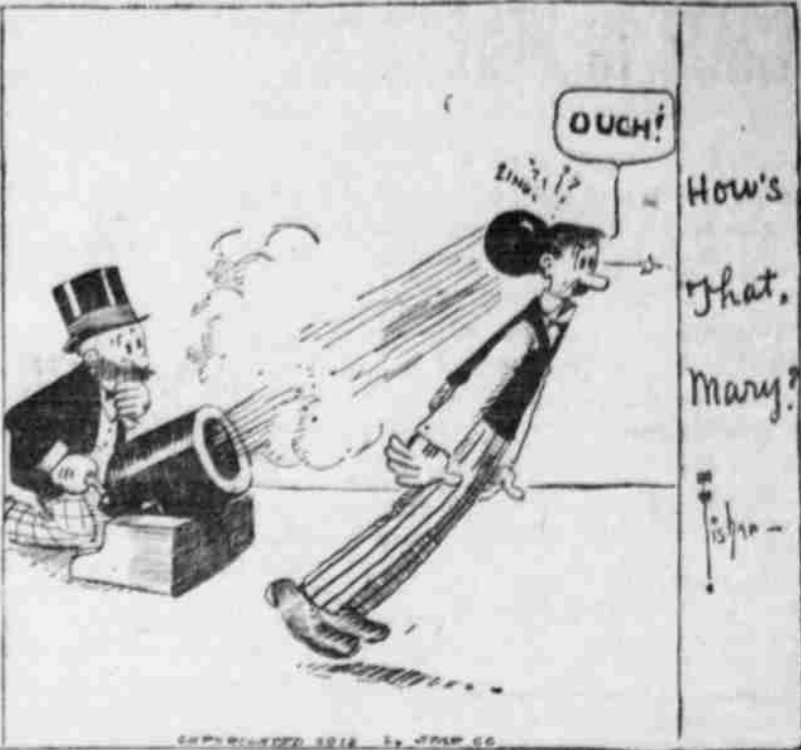
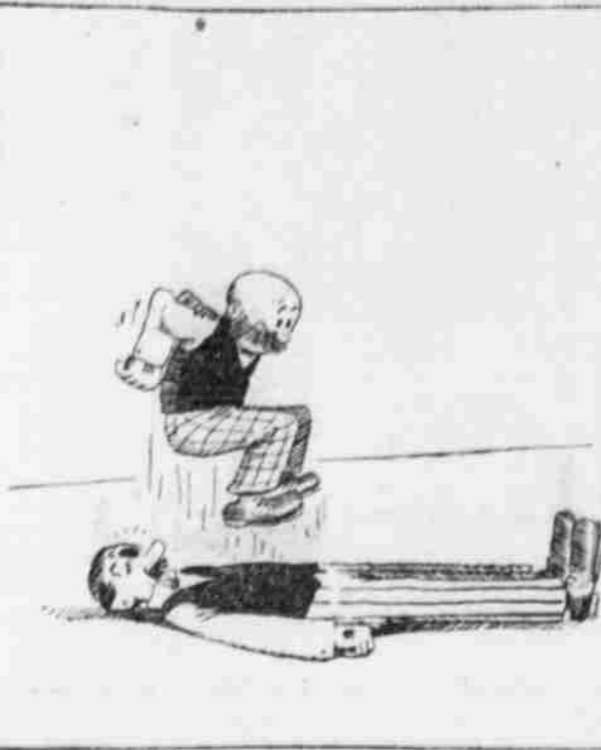
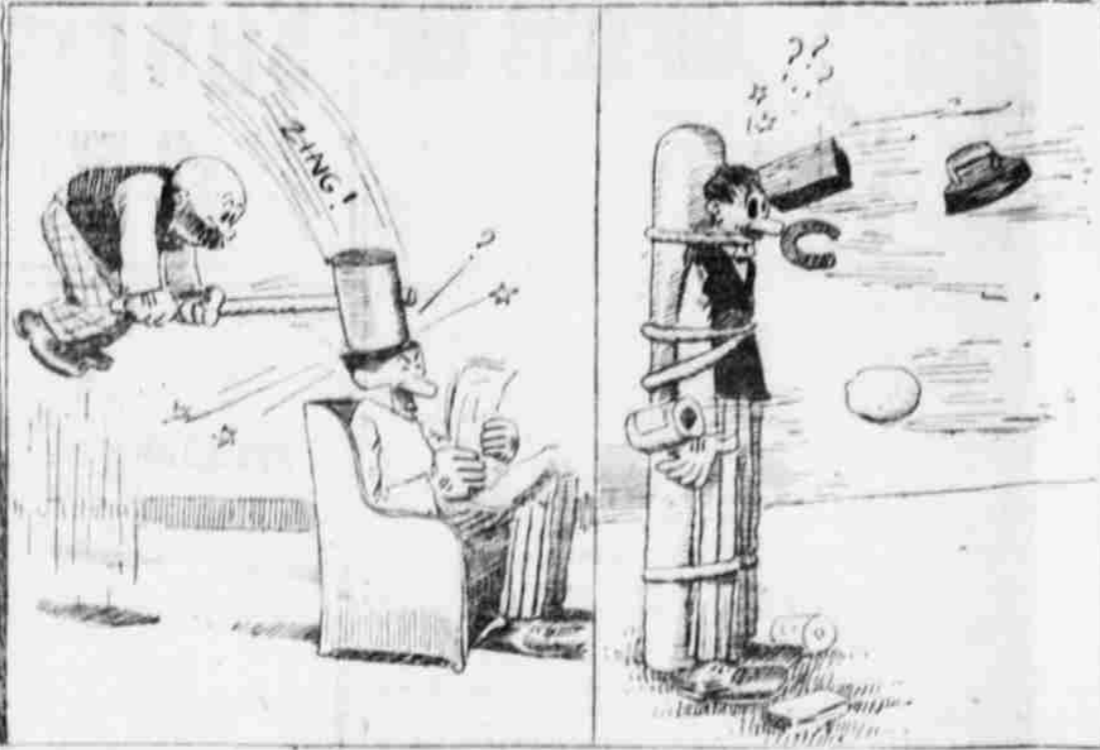


This One Is Just to Let Jeff Catch Up
