#### NO REDUCTION IN GREAT BRITAIN'S BUDGET

LONDON, April 2 .- No reduction in estimated expenditures is shown by the annual budget, iskued in the house of commons today by David Lloyd-George, chancellor of the exchequer. The budget also carries no increased taxation.

The entire surplus of the British treasury is shown to be \$32,750,000. all of which is retained to strengthen the treasury balance.

Lloyd-George estimates that the coal strike has caused a reduction of \$2,000,000 in government revenues and that before it is settled it will cause a reduction of \$4,000,000.


