GREEKS OBJECT TO BEING MOVED OUT OF RAYMOND

SEATTLE, Wash., April 2.—Suits aggregating probably over a quarter of a million dollars' damage will be started by the 200 striking Greek millworkers who were shipped out of Raymond, Wash., by "strong-arm" methods last Saturday against that city. The papers are being prepared today by some of the leading attorneys in Seattle. The Greek minister at Washington, D. C., has also been appealed to, and it is claimed that the action of the citizens of Raymond was in direct violation of treaty rights.
