## BOOSEY WANTS PUBLIC DEBATE

W. J. Boosey has issued the following open letter to Governor West:

To the Governor of Oregon—Dear Governor: Not having received any reply from you to my letter published in the Medford Mail Tribune of March 26, 1912, and sent you by registered mail, I now accuse H. K. Hanna, Robert S. Bean, Frank A. Moore and Robert Eakin, judges of the circuit and supreme courts of Oregon, of entering into and carrying on a conspiracy of felony on the 30th day of October, 1904, to violate Section 4310 B. & C. Code, which reads: "The corners and boundaries established in any survey made in pursuance of an agreement, or any survey, where no appeal is taken from the surveyor's report, and such corners as are established by the decree of the court shall be held and considered as permanently established and shall not thereafter be changed."

That they have from said date until the present time by many acts of felony attempted to destroy the officially signed corner bearing tree now at the northwest corner of the Boosey tract in Section 16, township 37 south range 2 west, placed there by James Jeffries, county surveyor of Jackson county, on the 30th day of May, 1888, for the purpose of marking the west boundary of D. L. C. No. 42 at that point as shown by his report in the official records of the county.

That their continuous violation of said statute was for the purpose of illegally destroying the warranty deed Armstrong to Boosey of date April 27, 1891 (whose initial point is marked by that tree) by a felonious decree of a court that had not jurisdiction thereof, and by said decree to illegally create title in three fraudulent quit claim deeds feloniously executed in violation of Section 1819. And I here challenge said judges to meet me in public discussion either on the platform or in the press, I to maintain, they to controvert the foregoing accusation from the law and records in the case. As Judge Hanna is now dead I substitute the name of his official successor, Frank M. Calkins, in said discussion.

And now dear governor I call your attention to Art. 5, Sec. 10 of the Oregon constitution which reads: "He (the governor) shall take care that the laws be faithfully executed."

Being a British subject I demand your official protection against the illegal discrimination of your lawless courts and your active support in my attempt to defend Oregon law and legal deeds, for if my warranty deed can be thus destroyed after an unquestioned possession of nearly 14 years, there is not a deed in Oregon worth the paper on which it is written. Your failure to act in this matter will compel me to appeal to the voters on behalf of socialism as the only recourse for property owners to defend the legal rights of private ownership.
