

RODGERS AERO FOR SMITHSONIAN

LONG BEACH, Cal., April 5.—S. I. Dekrafft, manager for the late Galbraith P. Rodgers, announced today that he had received an offer from a Chicago millionaire to purchase the aeroplane in which Rodgers made the first transcontinental flight and present it to the Smithsonian Institute in Washington. Dekrafft refused to tell the name of the prospective purchaser, but intimated that the offer probably would be accepted.

The city of Long Beach, which had prepared to erect a monument on the spot where Rodgers finished his ocean to ocean flight will erect a monument midway between the place of landing and the spot where the aviator met his death.

MORGAN SENT FOR BY POPE

LONDON, April 5.—Cables from Rome today say that Emperor William has "commanded" J. Pierpont Morgan to meet him in Venice soon. It is believed the conference will refer to the Turko-Italian war.

Morgan recently visited King Victor Emmanuel and it is said he then learned the best terms that Turkey can expect. If Morgan unofficially communicates these terms to the Kaiser the latter will probably forward them to the Turkish government.

It is reported that Morgan will urge the Kaiser to use his influence to induce Turkey to cede Tripoli to Italy, and thus to end the war.

SHIPWRECKED SAILORS MAROONED ON ISLAND

VANCOUVER, B. C., April 5.—Marooned on lonely Fanning Island 1200 miles southeast of Honolulu a gang of shipwrecked sailors, believed to be the crew of a British sailing vessel, which encountered a hurricane

and became waterlogged, are to be picked up by the liner Makura, en route from this port to Australia, according to word brought on the Canadian-Australian liner Zealandia, arriving here today. The rescue will take the Makura several hundred miles out of her course.
