RATE CASE IS AGAIN PUT OFF

WASHINGTON, April 8.—Another presentation of the intermountain case involving the long and short haul will be made in October of the present year, thus postponing the decision of the matter until next winter, according to an order of the United States supreme court here today. Chief Justice White announced that the case must be re-argued on October 15, before a full bench. Justice Pitney was not present when the case was submitted recently to the supreme court.
