

## IF MERRICK WINS ULRICH NOT TO RUN

"I will not be a candidate for county commissioner on the independent ticket unless George Dana of Ashland is nominated for county judge," states William Ulrich, who is busy campaigning in the interests of the Ashland man. "If Dana is nominated then Medford will be represented on the county court and so I will make the race."

Ulrich's friends are giving him the laugh today as his zeal on behalf of the Ashland man which led him to campaign for him in Josephine county. After working Woodville he continued north and was soon expounding the issues of the campaign before a large number of farmers on the Josephine side of the line. Bill claims it was his patriotism which led him to believe that Jackson county embraced the whole of Oregon.

## CHAPIN TALKS OF PROHIBITION

"The Church and the Schools" served as a topic from which Eugene W. Chaffin, candidate for president of the United States on the prohibition ticket at the last election, addressed a representative audience of citizens at the Medford opera house Wednesday night.

"Three things," said Mr. Chaffin, "have been responsible for every active reform or law of good government that we now enjoy—the church, the school and the conscience of the voter. To these we owe our splendid form of government. Our constitution is good, but Mexico has practically the same one. We depend alone upon our institutions—the church and the school and upon our national conscience."

Mr. Chaffin took no stand as to the political issues of the day and failed to mention the names of any of the presidential candidates.

"We do not elect men to fill office every four years," continued Mr. Chaffin. "We simply record the progress of the past four years and for the principle of the ensuing term. Officials are but means of carrying out history in the making and for the registering of reforms."
