

SUED FOR \$150 BUT PAID \$300

To sue for \$150 and get stuck for \$300 was the experience of James Bailey of Ashland who brought suit at Jacksonville against Victor Klein, formerly of Ashland, now of San Francisco, for money alleged due him for locating Klein upon a Josephine timber claim.

Klein paid Bailey \$100 as a locating fee and says that was the price agreed upon. Bailey claimed his fee was to have been \$250 and sued for the balance he claimed was due.

At the trial Klein set up a counter claim for \$1,100 on the grounds that Bailey—after locating him on the claim—got it away from him and into the hands of others by misrepresentation, greatly to his financial disadvantage. He claims he went upon the property and spent \$800 making improvements but was unable to make a living and had to go to the city to find work. While he was in San Francisco Bailey telegraphed him he was about to lose his claim through non-residence, but that he, Bailey, could get him \$250 for his improvements if he would relinquish. After several telegrams back and forth Klein got worried and relinquished for \$350 and others were located on the claim.

The jury decided that instead of Klein owing Bailey \$150 Bailey had damaged Klein in the transaction to the extent of \$300 and judgment was accordingly given Klein for that amount.
