LONDON, April 16.—It was announced here today that Harriet Quimby, an American woman, flew across the English channel today after posting here as "Mr. Griffith" and in France as "Mme. Alfrei." She crossed from Dover in her aeroplane, landing at Hardelot, France.

BOB WANTS U.S. TO MINE COAL

ALBANY, Ore., April 16.—Senator Robert M. La Follette of Wisconsin, made a national issue of the government mining of Alaska coal for the first time during his Oregon campaign while speaking here.

"Now is the time to take Morgan and the Guggenheims by the nape of the neck and throw them out of Alaska," said La Follette. "The Morgan banking interests control the authentic coal deposits of America and they charge \$6 a ton for coal which used to cost \$2 on the Atlantic seaboard."

"How much do you pay for authentic coal out here?"

"We don't burn it because it's too expensive but you can buy it in Portland for \$17 a ton" was the reply from a man in the audience.

"Seventeen dollars a ton! Think of it—and there, to the northward, an inexhaustible supply! I am for the immediate opening up of a government coal mine in Alaska. Let the government go into the market and get money at 3 per cent, build a railroad from the mine to tidewater, transport the coal in government ships to the Pacific coast and sell it to the people direct. It's your coal and you have a right to it."

Then he went into a detailed account of how the Morgan and Standard Oil banks control the finances of the nation and how they themselves should be controlled, regulated and the water squeezed out of their holdings.

STOCKTON MAN IS SOUGHT BY POLICE

LYNN, Mass., April 16.—An abandoned automobile, containing a Winchester rifle, which the police believe was used for the murder of George E. Marsh, the millionaire soap manufacturer found dead near here last Friday, was discovered here near the bank of the Charles river. The Boston police traced the number of the machine, and declare that the license is held by a man who came here from Stockton, Cal., who rented a room at No. 10 School street, from Mrs. Maude York.

TWO YEARS PEACE IN COAL FIELDS

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., April 16.—Provision for two years' peace in the bituminous coal fields is made today in the approval, by a referendum vote of the miners, of the bituminous wage scale compromise.

The agreement thus reached by miners and mine owners provides for an increase in wages of 5 cents per ton for mining screened coal and 3 cents a ton for unscreened coal. All helpers, drivers and other men employed in the mines are to receive an increase of 5 3/4 per cent in wages.
