PORTLAND, Or., April 16 .- Plans for the administration of the Chinese oaths to witnesses in the trial of Wong Si Sam, a Chinese, charged with the murder of Seid Bing, a fellow countryman, which began here today, were shattered when Judge Henry McGinn refused to allow such

"I will not allow this courtroom to he turned into a slaughter house,' said Judge McGinn, when it was proposed that a chicken should be decapitated each time a Chinese was sworn in as a witness so that he would be certain to tell the truth. "If a witness can't tell the truth without having a chicken killed he is not much good."
