They voted to put the track in first class condition and then turn it over to the Medford Driving club, which is to be organized and let that club give matinees, etc., and probably races the 4th of July. This will allow the fair association to devote its entire time and attention to the coming county fair which the directors are planning to make the best and biggest affair ever held in Jackson county.

A Round Up and Wild West show is to be a large feature of the amusement part of the fair and a strong effort will be made to secure large exhibits in every line, with special addresses by men from the Agricultural college at Corvallis and other places, men who are noted in their line of work so that the ranchers and farmers can come in and spend a profitable week.

Special premiums will be offered to all the school children of Jackson county for vegetables, grains and flowers that they grow this season. The directors ask the hearty co-operation of the merchants of Medford in advertising this fair and calling attention to the premiums offered and request special prizes from individuals and commercial bodies.

### HANNA NOMINATED BY 500 MAJORITY

In the district attorney race, unofficial returns would give Hanna a lead of practically four hundred over Johnson of Grants Pass. In Josephine county the votes stood 519 to 255, while Jackson county gave Johnson but 1596 against 826 for Hanna.

The vote in Josephine county as with other candidates, was extremely light, which accounts in a way for the overwhelming majority for Hanna.

### CHEER FOR ROOSEVELT, VOTE THE OTHER WAY

SAN FRANCISCO, April 23.—Senator La Follette, in commenting tonight on the recent western Roosevelt victories, declared it a fact that in virtually every western state where Roosevelt was choice for the presidential candidate the reactionary candidates for other offices won from their known progressive opponents.

In support of his assertion the Senator instanced the defeat of Bourne by Selling in Oregon, the defeat in Nebraska of George W. Norris, the progressive leader in the house by Norris Brown, and the defeat in Illinois of Walter Clyde Jones by Governor eenev, and of Hugh McGill by Lawrence Y. Sherman. He said another significant fact in the Illinois convention controlled by Roosevelt supporters was that while refusing to adopt the initiative and referendum and women suffrage planks while cheering Roosevelt.

### I. O. O. F. MEETS AT ASHLAND FRIDAY

Odd Fellows of Southern Oregon will celebrate the 92d anniversary of Odd Fellowship at Ashland Friday, April 26, with a convention, program, addresses by prominent Odd Fellows, a reception by Ashland, closing with a grand ball in the evening, which will be a social event. Much lodge business will be transacted, and state officers of lodge note are expected to be in attendance. The session will be one of the most important of the year, and much interest is being manifested in the occasion by members of the order.

Irish to Pass on Home Rule. DUBLIN, April 23.—Between three and four thousand delegates, representing all creeds and all classes in Ireland, assembled in convention in the Mansion House in this city today to exchange opinions and register the popular verdict in regard to the home rule bill now before the British parliament. The convention met in response to a call issued by John Redmond. It is generally expected that the measure will be endorsed as worthy of acceptance by the country, though changes in some of the details may be recommended.

### M'CUSKER LEADS FOR CONVENTION

Thomas McCusker, state campaign manager for Robert M. La Follette obtained the highest number of votes in this county as a delegate to the national republican convention which is to meet in Chicago in July to nominate a candidate for the presidency of the United States. C. W. Akerson, the first man on the ballot was second, Frank Patton was low man with only two votes in the entire county. S. B. Houston did but little better, securing but five votes throughout the county.
