

# OPEN SHOP WAR STRIKES SPOKANE

SPOKANE, Wash., April 24—Spokane today is on the verge of industrial war as a result of the fight over the open shop campaign of the employers. Following the open shop order of the building trades contractors, union men are walking out by scores today. Not only men in the building trades but plumbers, steamfitters and tinsmiths quit work today in many places.

The central labor council today made the announcement that a fight to a finish would be waged for a closed shop. The building trades council will meet tonight and a general strike of the union men in these trades probably will be declared and a walkout will follow tomorrow.

Besides the union men laying down their tools today many others declared their intention of quitting and it is believed a strike order will be obeyed by all members of the unions.

The employers say they intend no cut in wages but insist on opening their business "without interference" from unions. They say scarcity of work will aid them to win the fight.

The employers are placing striking men on the "taboo" list and are filling their places with non-union men.
