## COUNCIL MAY CALL ELECTION

The city council will meet again this afternoon for the purpose of further considering the matter of submitting to the people three amendments to the city charter, one relating to boxing contests, one in reference to the publication of assessment ordinances in the newspapers of the city, and the third in reference to the creation of a new office, that of police judge.

For some time the matter of allowing boxing contests in the city has been open to discussion, some being opposed to them and some in favor. To determine the will of the people in this respect the council is considering an election.

The council also will submit to the people the matter of publishing assessment ordinances in the newspapers of the city as is now required by the charter. Such an amendment has been twice defeated previously.

The matter of creating a police judge other than the mayor is also under consideration. At present the mayor helps frame ordinances and then is called upon to interpret them. As head of the police force also his duties conflict.

The council will meet this afternoon to take definite action in regard to the matter.
