

NO COMPROMISE IN DARROW CASE

LOS ANGELES, Cal., April 26.—There will be no compromise in the Clarence Darrow case, accused of having bribed and attempted to bribe jurors in the McNamara case, according to the statement today of Earl Rogers, counsel for the defense. Rogers refused to admit that the district attorney's office had asked that Darrow plead guilty and petition for clemency, although he declared that if such a proposition were made it would be disregarded. Darrow will go into court May 15. District Attorney Fredericks said today that the state's preparation for the prosecution is complete.

MAY NAME NEW STATION "COLVIG"

When shown the article in the Mail Tribune of yesterday stating that the station between Foot's Creek and Birdseye Creek would be named "Rosen," A. S. Rosenbaum, local agent of the Southern Pacific company, said that while he could not make the statement officially, he was satisfied the station would be called "Colvig," the name being appropriate inasmuch as Judge Colvig lived in that section of the county for years and has been prominent in the history of Southern Oregon. It is intimated a suggestion to that effect has been sent the Southern Pacific company, and the railroad directory shows no "Colvig" as a railroad station in America.

Upon complaint of Mrs. Nettie E. Carpenter, a warrant has been issued and served upon Charles Tschirgi, a real estate dealer, charging embezzlement. Tschirgi was released on bail of \$1000.
