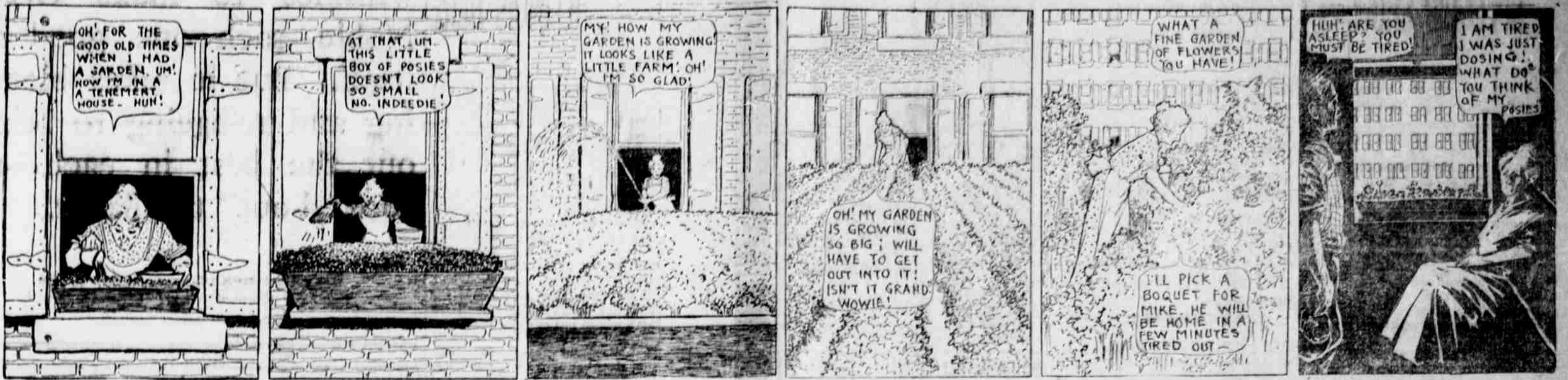


# Dream of a Lobster Fiend
