GERMAN GIRL SAID TO BE MURDERER

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., May 7.—Charged by the German government with being a murderer, a spy and with having stolen \$70,000 in gold in addition to valuable papers, Marie Puritz, aged 29 years, a Saxon girl, was arraigned here today before United States Commissioner Edmunds. She is charged with having killed Karl Cutlieb, Miss Puritz waived extradition, agreeing to return to Germany voluntarily. She emphatically asserted her innocence. The German government charges the girl with killing Cutlieb because he refused to allow his son to marry her and that she then stole the papers and money from his hiding place. She eluded secret service men until her recent arrest in Pittsburgh.
