STOCKS RECOVERING FROM RECENT SLUMP

NEW YORK, May 10.—Today's opening stock market showed decided strength. Missouri Pacific and Amalgamated Copper were up a point and United States Steel, American Smelting and some standard railroad issues made good fractional gains. Prices later showed further improvements. Illinois Central recovered almost two points from yesterday's weakness. American Can common made a new high record of 41 1/2, and the general list was strong. American Tobacco was up 6 1/2 points. The market closed dull. Bonds were irregular.

EFFORTS UNDERWAY TO END NEWSPAPER STRIKE

WASHINGTON, May 10.—Announcements that negotiations are in progress for settlement of the pressmen's strike in Chicago was made here today by an official of the American Federation of Labor, the federation he said being vitally interested in the fight because it had learned from an authoritative source that "a concerted movement has been inaugurated by Chicago publishers to destroy the efficiency of the organizations involved in the dispute."

The executive council of the federation met in secret session here last night to discuss the Chicago situation.

CHICAGO PRINTERS TO VOTE ON STRIKE SUNDAY

CHICAGO, May 10.—Whether the members of the Typographical union employed on Chicago newspapers will walk out in sympathy with the striking union pressmen will be decided Sunday when the printers will put the strike question to a vote, according to an announcement made here today.

Editors, copy readers, men and women from the business offices and employees of the circulation departments on the various papers went to work in the mechanical departments today to take the place of the pressmen and the stereotypers who walked out as sympathizers.

SPORTS BELIEVE BOXING GAME IS DEAD IN MEDFORD

That Chief of Police Hillson stepped into the ring Tuesday evening and stopped the McFarland-Anderson bout in its third round, under orders from Mayor Canon and that the boxing game is now a dead letter in this city is the belief of the local fans. The opinion is also ventured that the chief allowed the bout to proceed as long as it did in order that he might be assured that the fans would not demand their money back, as he, acting as a collector had \$157 of the receipts in his pocket.

City Attorney Porter J. Neff stated this morning that Mayor Canon had decided that the boxing contests were in reality prize fights and hence were a violation of the law. Therefore it is presumed that the mayor will in the future exercise his power as mayor, police judge and head of the police department to stop the bouts.

EMMA GOLDMAN TO SPEAK IN SAN DIEGO

SAN DIEGO, May 10.—Ben L. Reitman, manager for Emma Goldman, the anarchist lecturer, today sent from Los Angeles letters to Mayor Wadham and Secretary Chate of the local chamber of commerce saying that Miss Goldman had engaged a hall and would speak here on the nights of May 14 and 15. He asked Mayor Wadham to see that there was no interference with her, adding that she would lecture on the drama and that on previous appearances here there had been no disturbances. This was added doubtless in view of the so-called free speech fight here. He also said Miss Goldman would be glad to address the chamber of commerce on the "socialist unrest."

There has been talk of preventing the anarchist lecturer from coming here.

G. A. R. TO OBSERVE MEMORIAL DAY HERE

Arrangements for the fitting observance of Memorial day are now being made by the Chester A. Arthur post of the G. A. R. of Medford. H. Metz, chairman of the committee, has secured the city park for the holding of the exercises, preceded by a parade in which the post, Boy Scouts and the Medford military brigade will take part. The Woman's Relief corps will also take part in the parade and the exercises. The Boy Scouts will be in charge of Captain Beveridge and the brigade under command of Captain Canaday.

Sunday, May 26, the Memorial sermon will be delivered in the Christian church by the Rev. D. D. Boyle. The G. A. R., W. R. C. and Boy Scouts will attend this service in a body. Appropriate music is being prepared for the occasion. These services will be held at 2:30 o'clock in the afternoon.

On Decoration day a parade will be held, in which all the members of the G. A. R., W. R. C., Boy Scouts, Medford Military brigade and possibly the newly formed O. N. G., at this place will take part. D. Lawton will act as marshal of the day. An invitation will be extended to all the fraternal orders in the city to take part. The Medford band will head the parade, after which a march will be taken to the cemetery to cast flowers upon the last resting places of departed veterans.

The Rev. E. O. Eldridge of the Methodist church has been named as the orator of the day, the oration to be delivered from the bandstand in the city park.

A meeting of the committees of the W. R. C. and G. A. R. post will be held next week to complete the program for the day.

LA FIESTA GIVEN FOR SHRINERS

LOS ANGELES, Cal., May 10.—La Fiesta des Las Flores, the Carnival of Blossoms that once was the annual event in Los Angeles, was revived today for the thousands of visitors to the Shriner's convention and the floral parade, three miles long, which moved through the streets shortly before noon, was witnessed by almost 300,000 persons.
