

TIN PLATE TRUST IS UNDER FIRE

NEW YORK, May 13.—Admitting that \$10,000,000 of the capital stock of the American Tin Plate company was among its organizers, and denying that the formation of the mergers of which the company consists established a monopoly, Daniel Reed, president of the American company, testified today in the suit of the United States government against the steel trust.

Reid insisted that the formation of the American company saved many smaller tin plate companies from failure. He declared that there are now 236 companies in the merger and 202 independent companies. Many of these independent companies started up since the formation of the merger, he declared.

A spirited session followed Reid's advent as a witness, the tin plate president and United States Attorney Dickinson having frequent clashes.

RED FUNERAL I. W. W. VICTIM

LOS ANGELES, Cal., May 13.—Red clad men and women marching four abreast in a procession three blocks long today composed the funeral cortege of Joseph Mikolasek, Industrial Worker of the World, who was killed during a riot at San Diego.

Emma Goldman, anarchist lecturer, delivered a funeral oration in a hall decorated with red flags and mottoes used by the Workers in their "free speech" fight. She

roundly scored the San Diego authorities for their activities in the fight being waged there. Plain clothes officers who attended the funeral made no attempt to interfere. An immense red flag, carried at the head of the procession, also failed to evoke repressive action. The police held back traffic while the procession moved through the city streets.

PRESSMEN LEAVE 'FRISCO EXAMINER

SAN FRANCISCO, May 13.—The San Francisco Examiner issued an eight page edition today, devoted largely to classified advertising. The paper contained a statement declaring there was no personal animosity in the local pressmen's strike, as their men were acting solely on telegraphic orders.

In explaining the cause of the walk-out of the Examiner's pressmen, Web Pressmen's Union Local No. 4 issued the following statement today: "The fight started by the Hearst papers in Chicago against the web pressmen of Chicago reached this city Saturday, when orders came from the board of directors of the International Printing and Pressmen and Assistant's Union of North America to call out all pressmen in the employ of the Hearst paper here."

The Examiner statement declares that the curtailment of the size of its editions is only temporary.

HEAVY SNOWFALL IN COLORADO

DENVER, Col., May 13.—Colorado is in the grip of one of the heaviest snowstorms of the winter today. In this city the snow began falling at midnight, and continued until 2 o'clock this afternoon. Up to that hour six inches of snow had fallen, making the heaviest storm ever seen here in May, and one of the biggest of the winter. The storm was accompanied by a chilly wind causing all to wear heavy overcoats.

The snow was general throughout Colorado. In Colorado Springs most of the snow fell yesterday, changing to a blizzard last night. At Leadville it has been snowing for nearly thirty-six hours, with no indications as yet of abatement.

The heavy rain preceded the snow, materially helping the crops.
