RIVAL G. O. P. CONVENTIONS AT ABERDEEN FOR TAFT AND T. R.

ABERDEEN, Wash., May 16 .-Rival Roosevelt and Taft delegations will contest at Chicago for the fourteen seats of the state of Washington in the national republican convention. Two entirely separate state conventions that met in separate balls elected separate delegates and adopted separate platforms were held today.

The platform adopted by the Taft convention was largely an eulogy of President Taft and his administration. It denounced the recall of judges, demands the opening of Alaska to private acquistion and the withdrawal of unwarranted executive orders which have blighted that territory.

The Roosevelt platform favors the presidential primary law, initiative and referendum, recall of elective officers, including the judges, commends conservation of national resources and "home rule" for Alaska. After instructing for Roosevelt, the platform says if he cannot be nominated then "delegates shall be free to nominate Robert M. La Follette or some other progressive candi-
