ORDINANCE NO. 670.

An ordinance authorizing the entering into a contract on behalf of the City of Medford, Oregon, for the improving, curbing and paving of certain streets of said city, with the Clark & Henry Construction company, a California corporation.

The City of Medford doth ordain as follows: Section 1. The Mayor and Recorder of the City of Medford are hereby authorized to enter into a contract on behalf of said city with the Clark & Henry Construction company, a California corporation, in the following form, and said act by said Mayor and Recorder is hereby expressly ratified, authorized and confirmed.

This agreement, made and entered into this 13th day of May, 1912, by and between the Clark & Henry Construction company, a California corporation hereinafter called the Contractor, party of the first part, and the City of Medford, Oregon, a municipal corporation existing under the laws of the State of Oregon, party of the second part, hereinafter called the City.

Witnesseth, that the said Contractor, for and in consideration of the payments to be made and the covenants to be kept by the City hereinafter set forth, does hereby covenant and agree to furnish all materials and do all the work of excavation, filling, paving with asphalt, curbing and installing inlets, catch basins, monument cases, pipe and all other work and materials herewith on the streets and portions of streets and for the width hereinafter specified:

- 1. West Fourth street from Fir street to Grape street.
2. West Hamilton street from Oakdale avenue to Olson street.
3. Alley through block 55, Original Townsite, from Grape street to Holly street.

Forty-five acres five miles from Medford, about one-third in alfalfa and orchard, and balance partly cleared good land, and timber, and the tract is nicely watered. This is an opportunity to make a fine home, and get it at the very reasonable price of \$4500. Terms.

that portion of the general specifications submitted by the City Engineer which relate to maintain the pavement for a period of five years shall be considered stricken from said specifications and be no part thereof. The Contractor agrees to perform all of said work in a first-class workmanlike manner under the direction and supervision of the Engineer of said City, providing that in case any misunderstanding or disagreement between the Contractor and said Engineer as to the interpretation of the specifications, the matter shall be referred to and determined by the City Council of said City.

The Contractor further agrees that it will proceed with the work as designated by the City. In consideration whereof the City agrees to pay the Contractor for such work and materials at the following prices, namely: For excavation, per cubic yard \$.65 For curved, concrete curb, armoured, per lin. ft. .65 For straight concrete curb and gutter, per lin. ft. .66 For all pavement consisting of a 3-inch asphaltic concrete base and a 1-inch wearing surface, per sq. yard 1.50 For all pavement consisting of a 4-inch asphaltic concrete base and a 1 1/2-inch wearing surface, per sq. yard 1.71 For furnishing and laying 6-inch vitrified sewer pipe, per lin. ft. .55 For furnishing and laying 8-inch vitrified sewer pipe, per lin. ft. .65 Catch basins, each 21.00 Standard monument cases, each .50

The Contractor shall look for payment only to the fund reserved, located and paid into the city treasury for that purpose and will not require the City of Medford by any legal process or otherwise to pay the same out of any other fund, except as provided for by the charter, unless said City shall fail or neglect to provide such funds by valid assessments upon property affected.

The Contractor further agrees that he will at the time the same are offered for sale according to law submit a bona fide offer of par and accrued interest and will purchase at said price at the option of said City all improvement bonds which may be legally issued by said City pursuant to law for the payment of the work above provided for. Upon the completion of the improvement upon each street according to the contract, the City shall forthwith accept the work done and performed by the Contractor and this contract shall be to the extent of the work done and performed considered consummated, and the City shall forthwith proceed to create the lien provided for by law, upon the property benefited by such improvement, unless such assessment shall have been previously created and levied.

The Contractor shall receive warrants to the amount of eighty (80) per cent of the work completed each month and warrants for the balance of twenty (20) per cent shall be issued upon the completion of the contract; said warrants to be redeemed from the sale of improvement bonds or from money paid into the particular fund upon which said warrants are drawn.

The Contractor hereby agrees to furnish a bond for the faithful performance of this contract, to be approved by the City Council of said City, for the sum of One Thousand dollars (\$1000.00) guaranteeing in proper form the faithful performance of this contract and further indemnifying the City of Medford against any claims or liens for labor, work or material on account of subcontractors, material men, laborers, and mechanics, furnishing labor or material on this contract. It is further agreed that said work shall be commenced and prosecuted with all reasonable diligence and dispatch.

In witness whereof, said parties have caused these presents to be signed in duplicate by their respective officers and their respective corporate seals to be hereto affixed this 13th day of May, 1912.
