

## LAWYERS FIGHT ON TECHNICALITIES DARROW TRIAL

HALL OF JUSTICE, LOS ANGELES, Cal., May 25.—Indication that the trial of Clarence Darrow, charged with jury tampering in the McNamara murder case, will be replete with tedious technical fights between lawyers was made by the court proceedings during the morning session.

The defense has started a quibbling legal contest from the outset. It was made evident that Darrow's attorneys are going to fight every step of the way.

The prosecution took up the morning session with the establishing of records and laying the foundation for future testimony. Even though it was all preliminary, objections and arguments followed nearly every question asked by Assistant District Attorney Ford, who examined George Monroe, clerk of Judge Bordwell's court during the time the McNamara case was pending, the first witness called. The defense put up a particularly strenuous opposition to the introduction of any evidence laying the foundation for testimony as to other offenses than the one charged in the indictment—the bribery of Prospective Juror George N. Lockwood.

### GOVERNOR JOHNSON TO SECOND T. R. NOMINATION

SACRAMENTO, Cal., May 25.—On behalf of the California delegation which is in session in his office this afternoon Governor Johnson will second the nomination of Theodore Roosevelt at Chicago. He will not aspire to the temporary chairmanship of the convention, when the fight is made against Elihu Root for that position. So much he stated today. All other action by the 26 representatives of the party from this state will be decided by the conference this afternoon and by further conferences upon their special train which will be run to the convention city.
