

MEDFORD TAKES FIRST GAME

The fans who braved the elements yesterday were well repaid, as the game was a close and exciting one, Medford winning 6 to 1.

Grants Pass was unable to connect in the first two innings, although a couple of errors in the infield offered them some encouragement, but in the third, Weckler walked and scored on Baker's two sacker. Medford pocketed one in the first on Horton's bingle and a couple of errors, but went out one, two, three in the second and third.

In the fourth Schmidt drove a single into left field, and got second on Wood's sacrifice, but failed to score. In Medford's half Miles was hit by a pitched ball, and the next two men went out. Antle got first on Wood's fumble, Gill walked after being soaked, and Tamy's bingle scored Miles and Antle. The rest of the game was without any special features until the seventh, when two passes, Isaac's two bagger and Weckler's miff of Antle's fly netted the home team three more runs.

The credit for the victory clearly belongs to Burgess who struck out twelve men, and held the Pass down to three hits.
