

TO TEST LAW CLOSING ROGUE

At a meeting of the Rogue River Valley Fish Protective Association held Wednesday evening it was decided to provide a test of the law closing the river to commercial fishing at once, Robert L. Taylor of Medford, an ardent angler, offering himself as the victim to try out the law upon. Inasmuch as Judge Calkins will be holding court at Portland for the next month, habeas corpus proceedings will be resorted to, to bring the matter before the supreme court and secure a decision upon the construction of the law.

Applications to the state commission were signed for trout fry for the Applegate, Little and Big Butte and other streams. Requests are already in for the Four Mile Lake, Red Blasket and other tributaries.

I. I. W.'S TO SWITCH FROM LOS ANGELES TO SAN DIEGO

LOS ANGELES, May 29.—According to Judge McKelvey, secretary of the local Industrial Workers of the World, the present activities of that organization at San Diego will be curtailed and more attention paid to Los Angeles. McKelvey said the intention is to launch a movement for an eight-hour law in Los Angeles to include all trades. Labor conditions in Los Angeles, he declared, are the worst of any city in the state or the country.

At today's session of the federal grand jury investigating the industrialists' conditions at San Diego, six witnesses were heard, one of them the next door neighbor of Chief of Police Wilson, who is supposed to know something regarding the alleged attempt on Wilson's life.

At the cemetery, Colonel Roosevelt eulogized the civil war veterans.

In his speech to the engineers, Roosevelt referred to Congressman Fitzgerald's production yesterday of alleged memoranda which the latter alleged showed that Roosevelt in 1902 wanted to make his presidential job perpetual. He said:

"Fitzgerald's accusation is too preposterous to need serious discussion. Just as machinery can be expressed in terms of horsepower, so some intellects can be expressed only in terms of guinea pig power."

"That kind of accusation can be headed only by men with brains of about three guinea pig power."

State Bank Officials Slow

SEATTLE, May 29.—State bank officials are slow to meet the inquiries of the congressional committee which is making a country-wide investigation of the money trust. The questions seek information in detail on every phase of the bank's business. The state bankers question the jurisdiction of the committee except as to national banks.

Shot in Mining Scrape.

RENO, Nev., May 29.—Louis Carara is dead, George Flessa is dying and V. B. Terrill, a prominent mining man, is in jail today as a result of a dispute over mining property. The disputed claim was located by Terrill, and re-located by Flessa. Carara and Flessa were working the claim when Terrill came suddenly upon them and it is said shot both without warning.

Ship Litigation Ends.

SEATTLE, May 29.—After a year and a half of litigation, the libel suit of the steamer Kitsap against the steamship Indianapolis, is finally concluded today. In a written memorandum of his decision, Judge Hanford reviews the collision between the vessels in December 1910 and awards the Kitsap transportation company damages in the sum of \$13,608.18 without costs.

codes car in 2:24:46, Ralph DePalma smashed his second world's record. The previous record for the distance was 2:39:28.

Bruce Brown Is Out

Eddie Rickenbacher, relief driver at the wheel of a Firestone-Columbus quit in the 32nd lap owing to valve trouble. Bruce-Brown dropped out in the 26th lap from tire trouble.

In the 63rd lap, the McFarlan car, driven by Marquette, lost its two right wheels and was forced to quit. Neither Marquette nor Fowler, his mechanic and relief driver, was injured.

The 299 mile mark was passed with DePalma still leading in better than world's record time with Dawson pressing closely upon him.

In the 54th lap Hearne broke a cam shaft and withdrew. Anderson blew out a tire in the 56th and withdrew, and Liesaw quit with a broken cylinder-head in the 72nd lap.

The blowing up of Anderson's tire turned his Stutz car completely around on the track but both Anderson and his mechanic escaped injury.

DePalma Leads at 300

DePalma continued to lead at the 250 mile mark, having covered the half distance in 3:03:34, an average speed of 81 miles an hour. Wishart, driving a Mercedes, withdrew in the 82nd lap with his waterline connection broken, leaving the sole hope of the Mercedes centered in DePalma.

Dishrow withdrew with a blow-out differential pin in the 67th lap, leaving Hearne alone to represent the Case car.

At 300 miles DePalma still led with another world's record of 3:43:21. He was followed in order by Dawson, Burman and Bragg, who relieved Tetzlaff at the wheel of the Fiat car at this stage.

DePalma still led at 350 miles, with Dawson, Bruce-Brown's running mate, six minutes behind him and Bragg driving a close third. Dingley and Matson withdrew at this stage, leaving only 12 men in the race, all of whom are certain of prizes if they remain until the finish, as the race offers 12 prizes, ranging from the \$20,000 for the winner, down to \$1,000 for twelfth place.

DePalma retained the lead at the end of 400 miles, just 26 minutes and 31 seconds ahead of the world's record for the distance, which he covered in 4:54:34.

Burman's Cutting car was overturned in the 159th lap. Burman and his mechanic, Goetz, escaped uninjured.

MURDER CASE ARGUMENTS BEGIN

OAKLAND, Cal., May 29.—Argument in the Prescott murder trial was concluded shortly before noon today and following Judge Ellsworth's charge the case went to the jury. The court's charge was distinctly favorable to the defendant, Judge Ellsworth declaring that homicide is often justifiable, and the law of nature sometimes supercedes legal enactments.
