BIG RAIL STRIKE NOW THREATENS

SACRAMENTO, Cal., May 30.—A general strike of all trainmen employed by the big American railroads similar to that successfully waged by the railroad employes of Great Britain is being quietly agitated, it was learned here today, by the new union organization called the Federation of Federations. Fearful of the consequences of such a strike, President William Sproule and General Manager E. E. Calvin of the Southern Pacific railroad with the chiefs of all other western lines, have been in conference in New York for the past sixteen days, according to a prominent labor leader here, to formulate plans to cope with 350,000 railroad employes, who have formed the Federation of Federations. It was predicted here that as a result of the new organization which threatens to aid the Harriman shophmen now out on strike, Southern Pacific officials propose acceding to the demands of its 30,000 shophmen, and that the strike will end by July 1.

The primary will be the first of its kind held in this state. The names of Champ Clark, Woodrow Wilson and Judson Harmon will appear on the ballots.
