WHERE COUNTY FUNDS WENT IN PAST 4 YEARS

A complete report of the expendifures by Jackson county from 1908 to the present time was completed yeaterday by J. H. Wilson, the expert accountant recently engaged to expert the county books.

The report shows that the net debt of the county, July 1, 1908, was \$80, 937.49.

On June 1, 1912, the next debt was \$509,839.08, an increased in debtedness of \$428,901.59.

This increase was exceeded, how over, by the money spent in this per-iod for roads and bridges amounting ROUTINE MATTERS to \$483.617.66.

The distribution of expenditures during the four year term, including only 5 months in 1908 and 5 months in 1912, completed from the county clerk's distributing journal totalled \$760,399.88.





SEATTLE, June 5 - With delegates from Oregon and all parts of Washington in the city, the first session of the North Western Development Congress opened this morning at the Colisoum theater. The congress will not be in session in real earnest however, until the arrival today of the "booster" special train from Minneapolls and St. Paul which has picked up en route the delegates from the seven states of which the congress is representative-Idaho, Mintana, North and South Dakota, Minnesota, Oregon and Washington.

The primary objects of the congress are to inform the world of the advantages offered by the northwest and to effect an advantageous distribution of immigration. A campaign will be started to call the attention of the congress to the need of establishing on the coast immigration stations preceeding the opening of the Panama canal which will bring the western states face to face with new immigration problems.
