NEGRO OUTRAGES BRING WARSHIPS

WASHINGTON, June 6.—Aroused by official reports of atrocious crimes committed by negro insurgents in Cuba, the state department this afternoon advised Admiral Hugo Osterhaus, commander of the Atlantic fleet, to send the battleships Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri and Ohio to Guantanamo, the hotbed of the insurrection. In one case the negroes seized a former high official and then assaulted his wife and murdered his son before his eyes. Three instances of a similar nature were reported.

MEAT RIOT OVER HIGH COST LIVING

CHICAGO, June 6.—Fifteen hundred persons, most of them women, participated in a wild riot here this afternoon when H. O. Kovinsky started selling meat in violation of his agreement with 308 other kosher butchers who have refused to sell meat until prices are lowered. One man was stabbed during the riot and the windows of Kovinsky's shop were smashed. The meatstrike has been on here for some time as a protest against what the kosher butchers declare is an unfair boost in prices by the beef trust.

WARRANTS ISSUED FOR THREE CEOLS

As a result of a quarrel of long standing, W. H. Chapman, age 70 years, is suffering from a slight fracture of the skull at his home in the Lake Creek district and warrants have been issued for Frank Ceol, his wife and daughter Annie, charged with assault Wednesday. Chapman was attended by Dr. Seeley, and is reported in a serious but not necessarily dangerous condition unless complications arise. It is alleged in the complaint that Chapman was struck over the head by a shovel in the hands of Ceol, and that his wife and daughter aided with blows from hoes and rakes, while Chapman was in the act of turning water in an irrigation ditch over which there has been civil suits, extending over a period of 10 years. Ceol has been the loser in his contentions in the courts. Two witnesses, who viewed the attack from a nearby point, say the aged man was attacked while his back was turned. The complaint was sworn to by prosecuting attorney B. F. Mulkey, and the preliminary hearing will be held, subject to improvement in the condition of Chapman.
