Colonel Stone's action, he said, was prompted by the reports that certain Roosevelt leaders had prepared to take steps to intimidate the membership of the committee in its deliberations. Other members of the committee, including Colonel New, Senator Crane and Senator Sanders, said they heard reports of a planned Roosevelt demonstration at the committee room during the hearings.

"There will be no 'rough house' in committee," said Stone, "neither will there be any demonstration permitted outside the Coliseum. Drastic measures will be adopted if anything of the kind is attempted." Colonel New said he had heard the reports of possible trouble but was loath to believe them. New said the report sounded incredible as no one was foolish enough to think anything would be gained by such methods. The amount of business done was remarkable and shows how the residents of the city appreciate the market,

Meats were on sale this morning and a line of women extending through the building testified to its attractiveness as a drawing card. A large business was done at the meat stall while across the aisle a farmer offered a large number of country hams, bacon and lard and did a splendid business.

Before 8:30 a. m. over 200 chickens had been disposed of at the market. R. P. Little brought over a load of poultry and was not permitted to reach a stall the women buying all he had to offer before he could get inside of the building.

The offerings of vegetables were very large and covered a wide range New potatoes were a feature and were eagerly seized upon.

Fully 600 buyers patronized the market before noon today. At 9 o'clock this morning a count showed 180 in the market at one time.


