

FINANCIAL EXHIBIT OF JACKSON COUNTY, OREGON

The following pages contain a true statement of the financial condition of Jackson county, Oregon, brought down to June 1st, 1912.

In ascertaining the present debt I have listed the outstanding warrants from the Clerk's warrant register. In ascertaining the amount of interest accumulated on the debt, un-enclosed, I have estimated interest from the day the warrant was issued to the 1st of June, 1912, using the treasurer's interest tables in computing interest.

In ascertaining the amounts tabulated as expenditures, I have used the Clerk's Distribution Journal, and for the tabulation of amounts paid by Treasurer, I have used his monthly reports.

In ascertaining the cost of the bridges I have obtained this cost both from the Clerk's warrant register, his bills, the contract price, and the Roadmaster's statement.

The Road and Bridge Account Includes Bridges as Follows: Two bridges, Phoenix and Ashland, Bear and Emigrant, \$8615.65; Foot Creek, 1,535.72; Central Point bridge, Bear Creek, construct and repair, 7,429.99; Woodville, across Rogue river, 15,733.70; Medford, repair and new decking, 675.74; Gold Hill, over Rogue river, 11,367.04; Upper Rogue river, 8,285.00; Lower Rogue river, 12,185.52; Big Butte, 3,182.00; Miscellaneous, small bridges scattered throughout county, 5,784.66; Total, \$74,795.02.

The Road and Bridge Account for 1911 Also Includes: Rock Quarry at Griffin Creek, 10 A, \$750.00; Road Engine and Machinery (bought in 1911), \$3,375.60; Equipment bought in 1911, 2,917.55; Cement and culverts about in 1911 for general use, 12,682.03; Total, \$48,825.18.

Memorandum in Relation to Items in the Distribution of Expenditures by County Warrants. The sheriff's assistance for 1912 includes board and care of prisoners. The county clerk's assistance, 1912, includes amount paid for extending tax levy.

The school superintendent assistance includes, in addition to office help, the expense bills of the superintendent while traveling, the cost of examining school papers, and supervisors and all cost of education connected with his office. Fruit inspection covers all the expense of that department. Court house expense includes metal, furnishing of clerks' vault, record books, typewriting and adding machines, construction of cement coping and pavements, woodshed, toilets, etc. Current expense includes all items of expense not otherwise enumerated.

ANNUAL REPORT OF ALL WORK DONE BY SUPERVISORS IN YEAR OF 1911.

Road District No. 1. 7 miles cleared and made. 90 miles repaired. 1 old bridge torn out and 42 foot fill put in its place, 40 feet wide, 11 feet high and 100 feet long. 3 30-foot bridges, covered with new plank. 1 10-foot bridge covered with new plank. 3 12-lb. tubes; 20-22-28 feet long, respectively. 1 116-foot fill raised 3 feet and widened 14 feet. GEO. W. JONES. Amount spent, \$5295.55.

Annual Report Road District No. 2. Graded 1 1/2 miles on the North Phoenix road. Graded 1 mile on Phoenix-Burrell road. Repaired 1 1/2 miles on Carpenter-Griffin Creek road. Graded 1/2 mile on Jacksonville and Yreka road. Graded 1/2 mile on Phoenix-49 Mine road. Five days repair work with full crew on Coleman and Griffin Creek road. Graded 3 1/2 miles on road for Morse and Beeson, Talent. Graded 1/2 mile on Dunn road, Talent. Graded 1/2 mile on Oak street, Ashland road. Opened and graded 1 mile on Walte road, Ashland. Put in 31 corrugated tubes on general road work and removed the old bridges and culverts. 4 days work with full crew on Ashland mine road. Graded and repaired 2-4 mile of road on Ashland Orchard Co. road. Laid 1900 feet of 4-inch tile on Medford-Ashland road. Repaired 11 bridges in this road district. Graveled 1 mile on North Phoenix road. Have done repairs on all roads in district No. 2. Worked on Bear Creek at Phoenix five days with full crew building bridge protections. The grading work was all completed ready for surface coat which was not put on because of lack of material. S. G. VAN DYKE. Amount spent, \$7181.34.

Annual Report Road District No. 3. Number of culvert tubes on road: 5 48-inch tubes complete. 1 36-inch tubes complete. 4 18-inch tubes complete. 9 12-inch tubes complete. 19 culverts, taking from one to five days. More or less work done on 36 miles of road. 1 mile of new road built. 1 1/2 miles of old road graded ready for rock. 3 new 16-foot spans on both ends

of the bridge at Applegate and other. 5 days work on grade with three teams and four men. A. THROCKMARTIN. Amount spent, \$2795.72. Annual Report Road District No. 4. 1/4-mile plowed and leveled on Vander Hellen lane. Graded 3-4 mile between Agate store and Agate depot. Fresno filling all along new road on desert. Hauled material to Central Point bridge. 114 rods east of Palmer's graded. 1/4-mile of road graded near Willow Spring house. 1/4-mile new graded road south of Agate up to Fish bridge. 1 1/2-foot tube 48 feet long at foot of Pruet hill. 1 1-foot tube 22 feet long near Phipps orchard. 24 feet of bridge walled with stone, 37 1/2 feet; fill 2 feet deep and 15 feet wide on north side of bridge and 840 feet fill 1 foot deep, 15 feet wide near Phipps orchard. 1 36-inch tube 22 feet long, 70 feet of fill 3 feet deep and 15 feet wide, walled with stone near Kincaid's. 1 1-foot tube 22 feet long near Central Point cemetery. 1 1-foot tube 22 feet long near Willow Spring school house. 1/4-mile of new graded road near Willow Spring house. 61 2-3 yards gravel on same road. 89 yards of gravel between Ralph dens and Central Point. 13 yards of gravel near Central Point cemetery. Decked 33 feet of bridge 1 mile northwest of Central Point. 1 18-inch tube 20 feet long near Jo. Hoglands. 44 2-3 yards gravel on old road by Hogland's. 304 yards gravel on old road between Upton's and Palmer's. 32-foot bridge decked and banistered near Penniger place. 24 foot bridge walled with stone, 840 ft. fill, 22 ft. wide and 3 feet deep through a slough in W. W. Gregory's field. 3-foot tube 22 feet long, walled with stone, 60-foot fill 2 feet deep, 1 1/2 miles south of Kincaid's to Eagle Point mile post. 23-foot bridge with 60-foot fill 3 feet deep and 15 feet wide, near Niles. Graded 1/4-mile east of Bell ranch and 1/2-mile west by Niles'. 24-foot bridge walled with stone and 20-foot bridge walled with stone 1/4-mile south of Central Agate depot. 537-foot fill, 3 feet deep and 22 feet wide. 1 18-inch tube 22 feet long and a one-foot fill 40 feet long and 22 feet wide on new road at Forbe's slough. Graded 1 1/2 mile of road south of Agate depot to Davla's land. 26-foot bridge walled with stone and 112-foot fill 3 feet deep and 22 feet wide. This is at Forbe's slough. 4009 yards of gravel hauled on the sticky lane. 110 yards at Biby's bridge—480 yards from Biby's bridge to Agate. 21 yards from Agate to Fish bridge. 16 yards at Fish bridge—31 yards at Hoard bridge. 66 yards of stone at slough south of Story's—78 yards at Dry Creek. 13 yards near Ed Phipps—2 1-foot tubes 22 feet long near desert boulevard. 36 feet of decking on bridge southwest of Central Point. 15 feet of decking on Rogue river bridge. 100 feet of decking on Antelope

COUNTY DEBT OF JACKSON COUNTY, OREGON, July 1st, 1908.

According to the County Clerk's semi-annual account, filed October 1, 1908, there was outstanding on October 1st, 1908, against Jackson County: For called warrants \$7,297.41; For warrants in clerk's hands \$682.80; For warrants, protested, not called \$88,891.26. Total \$96,871.47. For interest on called warrants \$554.27; For interest on protested warrants \$2,119.77. Total outstanding warrants and interest \$100,525.24. Deduct warrants issued in August and September, 1908 \$2,201.19. Balance \$98,324.05.

Add warrants paid during July, August and September, 1908. Principal \$12,453.59; Interest \$909.00. Total \$13,362.59. Warrants outstanding July 1st, 1908 \$91,937.64. Cash in treasurer's hands, July 1st, 1908, applicable to the redemption of county warrants (Ledger 9, page 2) \$19,039.03. Net debt, July 1st, 1908 \$72,898.61. Add warrants issued July, 1908, on account of debt due and owing, July 1st, 1908 \$8,038.88. Net indebtedness July, 1908 \$80,937.49. This debt was subject to some modification on account of uncollected taxes then in the sheriff's hands for collection.

COUNTY DEBT OF JACKSON COUNTY, OREGON, June 1st, 1912. Outstanding warrants \$502,628.19; Interest thereon \$29,153.31. Total June 1st, 1912 \$531,781.50. In the treasurer's hands, applicable to the payment of called warrants and interest \$24,515.63. Balance \$507,265.87. The remaining half of unpaid state taxes, 1912 \$52,685.50. Total debt, June 1st, 1912 \$559,951.37. According to the sheriff there is cash in his hands, about to be turned over, applicable to payment of debt \$19,508.62. In treasurer's hands applicable to the payment of debt \$30,583.67 \$50,092.29. Net county debt, June 1st, 1912 \$509,859.08. This debt is subject to modification on account of uncollected taxes now in the sheriff's hands for collection.

Annual Report Road District No. 10. Housed one bridge. New bridge built at Squaw Creek, 20-foot span. New bridge on Bever creek, 36 ft. span. New decking for 26-foot bridge on Sterling road. Built 24 culverts and drain boxes. 24 feet 36-inch tube at Spencer's Gulch. 28 feet 36-inch tube at Swayn's cut. 24 feet 36-inch tube at Farmer's ditch. 22 feet 36-inch tube at Park's place. 24 feet 36-inch tube at Klinhanner's place. 1 1/2 miles of road graded and graveled road, sections 3-10. 3-4-mile road graded and graveled, 16-inch grade, section 15. 1 mile road graded and graveled, 16-inch grade, section 22. 15 miles of Big Applegate road repaired. Section 15, Ned's Gulch boulder fill. Section 22, repaired Applegate bridge. 1 1/2 miles graded and graveled up Little Applegate. 1/2-mile graded and graveled, sections 20-29. 4 miles graded and rocked. W. R. GARRETT. Amount spent, \$8201.87.

Annual Report Road District No. 11. Graded in and through sections 10-11, 1 48-inch culvert in section 10. 1 36-inch culvert and L 12-inch culvert in section 15. Covered road in section 15 with rock. Graded 1/4-mile in section 22. Decked 1 20-foot bridge in section 23. 1 12-inch culvert in section 23. Repairs on roads in sections 27 and 30. Covered with crushed rock road in section 16 for 1/4-mile. Graded 2 miles of old road in Sardinia Creek. 1 mile of new road with 10-foot fall. 1 18-foot bridge. 5 culverts in sections 17-8-5-32. 1 12-inch culvert in section 13. 1 48-inch culvert with 8-foot fill in section 19. 24-inch culvert with 3-foot fill in section 27. 1 12-inch culvert in section 22. 1 new 12-foot bridge on Foots Creek. Riff-raff under the roadbed on Foots Creek, hauled the steel and cement for that bridge and filled both sides of the creek. Repaired the old road from Woodville to the county line on north and south sides. 1 48-inch culvert, 3 12-inch culverts and graded 1/2-mile on west side of Evans Creek. Graded 400 yards of dirt on both

sides of Gold Hill bridge. 11 miles of grade and regrade on east side of Evans Creek. 45-foot bridge (new), 6 12-inch culverts, repaired the Sat. Creek bridge, and replaced all the plank in all the small bridges on the west side of Evans Creek. 2 miles of new road in the Meadows (mostly rock.) 1 new bridge 35 feet long, Meadow district. Graded and repaired 1/2-mile of the old Bybee grade, through very hard rock. Repaired the Sam's Creek bridge in Sam's Valley district. Repaired 1 mile of the road in the Blackwell district. J. W.
