

### NEWSCHOOL BOARD NAMES COMMITTEES FOR YEAR'S WORK

The new school board held its first session Friday morning and organized for this year's work. The annual financial report was considered, a chairman and clerk elected and committees appointed for the ensuing year. The board is composed of J. L. C. Kentner, J. W. Lawton, E. R. Seely, George Marshall and J. H. Cochran. H. C. Kentner being the senior member of the board was elected chairman as provided by law and Oris Crawford was re-elected clerk. The following committees were named:

- Finance—Marshall and Lawton.
  - Insurance—Cochran and Seely.
  - Building—Seely and Marshall.
  - Repair—Lawton and Marshall.
  - Judiciary—Cochran and Seely.
  - Supplies—Cochran, Lawton and Marshall.
- The annual financial statement prepared by Oris Crawford, clerk shows as follows:
- Bonded indebtedness, \$125,000.
  - Outstanding warrants, \$47,338.20.
  - Estimated value school buildings, \$185,000.
  - Insurance carried, \$123,700.
  - School census 1817; teachers 42; school rooms 37; enrollment above eighth grade 222; number library books 1600.
  - During the past year the receipts of the district totalled \$86,753.34; the expenditures \$85,895.13, leaving a balance of cash on hand of \$858.41.
  - The district paid out \$26,452.88 for teachers salaries; \$1078 for fuel; \$2643 for janitor work; \$3959 for repairs and improvements (including paving); \$26,785 for new school houses; \$9500 for school sites; \$1724 for furniture.

### TOURIST LOST CRATER FOREST

John Grieve, pioneer of the Prospect country, and well known citizen of this city, came down from the upper country Tuesday with a story of more than ordinary interest having to do with a young Chicago man who recently started from the Windy City on a tour of the world, traveling west, says the Central Point Herald.

E. W. Brown is his name and his main object in making the trip is to study the poultry business in the various parts of the globe and to see the many points of interest en route. Since leaving Chicago Mr. Brown visited Yellowstone Park and portions of California. Starting north he felt the call of Crater Lake and although too early in the season for a safe attack, he attempted to storm the citadels of that Silent Land alone. He made the rim of the lake all right but was unable to make the descent to the water line. After safely negotiating the trip back to the Government camp he tried to take the trail for Prospect. Eight feet of snow, however, made trail finding difficult and for three days and nights the young man struggled through the slush and snow without food or fire. Finally when almost ready to lie down and die he was found by a party of cattlemen who were returning from Klamath and by them was brought to the Grieve Hotel at Prospect where he was given every attention. Brown was crazed by his awful experience and it was only after two or three days of careful nursing and attention that he was able to tell his story. He will continue his globe tour as soon as he is fully rested but does not expect to encounter any more strenuous experience than that which came to him on the upper reaches of the Rogue between Crater Lake and Prospect.

Henev was furious but retained his self-control and began the argument by declaring that the chief question involved was the right of a sovereign state to decide how its election should be conducted.

"The fact that both factions submitted to the state law and made affidavit that they did so submit," he said, "proves that the Taft men have no standing in this convention."

Henev then sketched the California primary law and showed that it was passed especially to aid in securing a popular expression of the will of the people of the state on the presidential

referendum and the recall. "The people of a sovereign state cannot be robbed of their rights," he continued. "For forty years California, like Pennsylvania and Colorado had been robbed and misruled by railroads. Two years ago the people of California declared their independence and they wrote their independence into the state law by the initiative,

the referendum and the recall. "Such revolutionary doctrines as this have startled such men as the distinguished gentleman who is presiding over this body and also Big Steve of Colorado."

Watson when Payne concluded, read a brief in support of the Taft contention. He was frequently inter-

rupted by the Roosevelt delegates. Then Governor Johnson replied: "This principle is far greater than the determination of a district contest. It strikes at the rock upon which republicanism progressed in the United States is founded," he said. "This question is the one that will be the big issue from now until November. Shall the people rule?"
