CHINA REJECTS PLAN OF FOREIGN FINANCIERS

WASHINGTON, June 25.—The state department announced today that the Chinese government has rejected the plan agreed upon by the international banking group for the supervision and control of the expenditures of the six-power loan as well as for the foreign administration of the salt monopoly.
