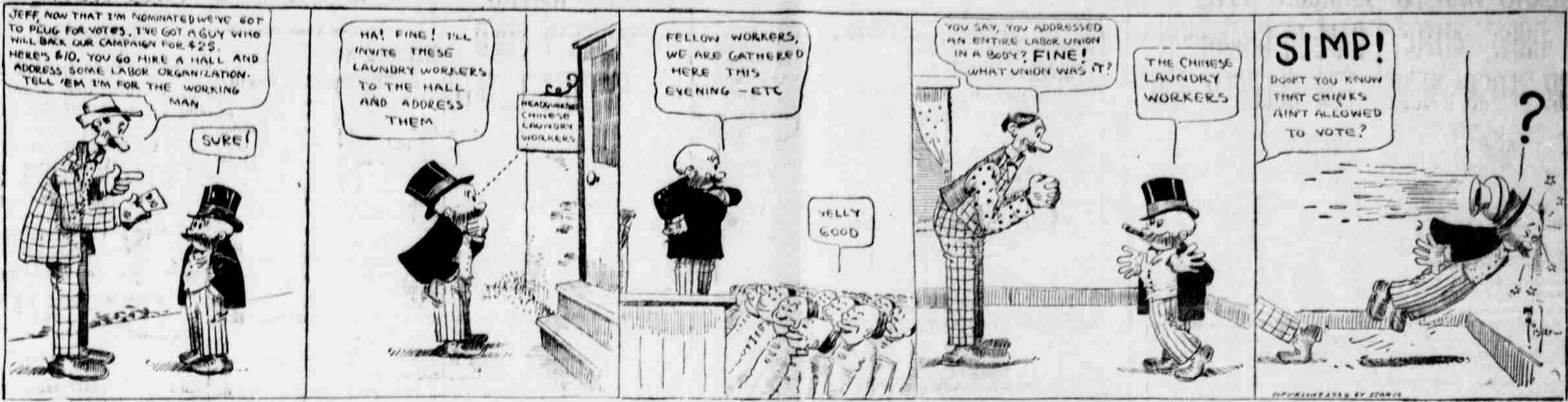

PROBE HANFORD'S ACTION IN ESTATE

SEATTLE, Wash., July 9.—Involved R. A. Hallinger, former secretary of the interior and other prominent attorneys with Judge Hanford in a bankruptcy case in which the whole estate of \$60,000 was, it is alleged, gobbled up by Jerald L. Finch, former deputy prosecutor in the Hanford trial late yesterday and today opened up a new line of investigation.

Finch in relating his connection with the bankruptcy case and its developments gave the most sensational testimony yet brought out in the impeachment proceedings. So dramatic was his recital of the affair, that the crowd in the court room sat silent for hours listening to his clear and concise narrative.

The bankruptcy case in question was known as the Heckman case. Finch told the congressional committee that he had made in open court the charge that there was a conspiracy to give the Scandinavian American Bank possession of the property involved in the bankruptcy proceedings, that five creditors with a total claim of \$23,000 manipulated the appointment of a trustee in bankruptcy, that the receiver made a report that there was no property in the estate, in spite of the fact that it was shown by evidence that there was three times the amount of property than all of the liabilities.

The prisoners, nine of whom practically were found guilty of murder and the remainder of having been accomplices in a blackmailing conspiracy, wept, cursed, and at times begging the court for mercy and at others denouncing the jury as murderers and assassins of character.

STATE CLOSES ITS CASE; NOTABLES PRAISE DARROW

LOS ANGELES, Cal., July 9.—The state rested late Monday in the trial of Clarence Darrow and immediately began to fight against the conviction on the charge of bribery in the McNamara case. The defense opened its case by reading a formidable array of depositions taken in Chicago testifying to the high standing of Darrow in his profession and in politics. Among those whose depositions were read were former United States Senator Mason and former United States Senator Hopkins, Mayor Harrison of Chicago, and his predecessor, Fred A. Busse, Ex-Mayor Washburn, Ex-Chief Deputy of Illinois S. P. Shope, Judge Orrin, N. Carter and James Hamilton Lewis. All of these paid high tribute to Darrow's character as a lawyer and a man.
