ELECTION EXPENSES MUST BE PUBLISHED

WASHINGTON, July 12.—Contending that the senate investigating committee's inability to obtain any detailed information regarding receipts and expenditures of presidential campaign funds emphasized the necessity for a law requiring publicity of such information before election, Representative Henry of Texas, in an interview today urged the necessity for the senate passing his bill to this end.

"The senate committee's inability to get authentic information concerning use of campaign funds in the Parker-Roosevelt campaign clearly shows the necessity for such a law as I have proposed," Henry declared.

"The candidates for president and vice president owe it to the people to make an itemized and detailed statement which shall be sworn to, of all contributions and expenditures in their campaigns for the purpose of influencing their selections.

"Senators and representatives under the law passed last year must render an accounting of their financial expenditures. It seems to me that it is vastly more important that such a law should govern presidential and vice presidential candidates."
