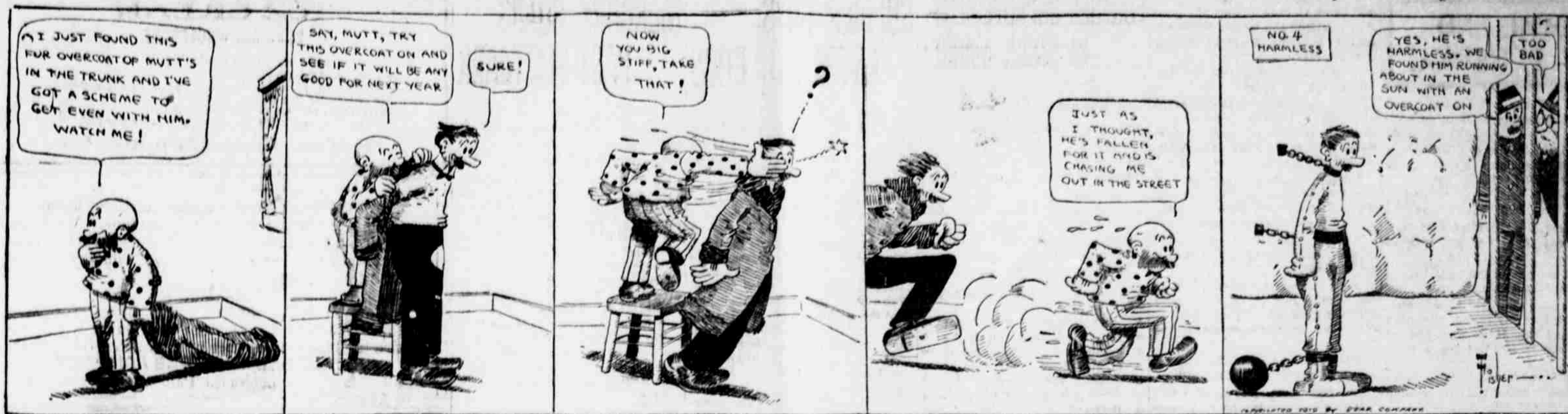

ISSUES CALL FOR BULL MOOSE PARTY

PORTLAND, Or., July 16.—At a meeting of the National Progressive club of Oregon held in the East Side Library building last night, a call was issued for a state convention of the National Progressive (Roosevelt) party.

The convention will meet in the East Side Library building, East Eleventh and Alder streets. Arrangements are being made for the convention to adjourn in a body to larger quarters, should such be necessary.

The Oregon delegation will go to Chicago instructed as to candidates for president and vice-president, while matters of political policies of moment to the progressive party will be considered.

The motion by which the call was made declared that the progressive party had its birth because the republican national convention of Chicago failed to represent fairly and fully the wishes, views and interests of the people at large.
